Positions requiring election are: Commander, Senior Vice Commander, Junior Vice Commander, Quartermaster, Chaplain and one Trustee. No member may hold two elected positions. See, Sec. 215, VFW By-Laws.

We encourage our new members to consider elected office or seek the appointed offices of Adjutant, Judge Advocate or Surgeon. The nomination and election processes are set forth at VFW Manual of Procedure (MOP) 217, and the duties of the elected/appointed officers are set forth at VFW Manual of Procedure (MOP) Sec. 218.

Remember: If you're shy about asking someone to nominate you, you can nominate yourself. Nominees may accept a nomination in person at a meeting or by submitting a written acceptance.

STATE INACTION SICKENS ANOTHER VET AT QUINCY HOME

Legionnaires Disease has killed 13 people at the Quincy IL veterans' home operated by our fiscally irresponsible and insolvent state government. And despite the state spending \$6 million to upgrade Quincy's water system, this fall three more residents tested positive for legionellosis, including one who died.

According to the Feb 21, 2018 Chicago Tribune, "the Illinois Dept of Public Health on Tuesday announced a fourth case of Legionnaires' disease in recent weeks at the state-run veterans' home in Quincy, a notice that came just hours after Senate Democrats held the latest in a series of hearings about the outbreaks. The latest patient is in stable condition, according to the agency."

The NewsGram suggests that the next time a well-meaning IL citizen offers you that sincere "Thank you for your service," you should respectfully reply with "And thank you for Legionnaire's disease." Then ask which self-interested, corrupt, pension hungry career politicians they voted for in the March primary.



BACK STABBING AT VA??

According to the Feb 28, 2018 USA Today, one of the top deputies to VA Secretary David Shulkin has actively lobbied Capitol Hill to demand his boss's resignation, according to two people with knowledge of the effort. John Ullyot, the VA's assistant secretary for public affairs, asked a senior aide at the House Committee on Veterans Affairs to persuade lawmakers to call the White House and say they wanted Shulkin out, said both individuals, who spoke on condition of anonymity because of the sensitive nature of the situation.

Ullyot denies it happened. But the two sources said he made the request in a call initiated by VA Press Secretary Curt Cashour on Feb. 15, the day after the release of an inspector general's report that concluded Shulkin had misused taxpayer dollars during a European trip last year.

Cashour and Ullyot provided a joint statement acknowledging they made the call but denying they sought help to push Shulkin out. Cashour previously worked as press secretary for the House veterans' committee from 2013 until January this year. He became VA press secretary in June. Ullyot worked on Trump's campaign and his transition team before becoming assistant VA secretary for public and intergovernmental affairs in April.

A power struggle between a group of political appointees and Shulkin and his longtime aides at the agency has divided the top ranks of the VA for months. But it spilled into public view following the release of the investigation report, when Shulkin told reporters the political appointees were undermining him.

Editor's Comment: The VA is second only to the Dept of Defense in size. The VA employs over 377,000 people at over 1700 VA sites including medical facilities, clinics, benefits offices, and cemeteries. It probably is the largest employer of public sector union employees in the nation. And the pay and retirement benefits offered by the VA may be second only to public sector employment in corrupt states like Illinois. Anyone with the courage and audacity to try and modernize the VA into a cost-effective, high quality service provider runs into a gauntlet of union bosses, contractors and lobbyists servicing this antiquated behemoth and their patsies in Congress, all of whom have a vested interest in the status quo. Go ask prior VA Secretaries Shinseki and McDonald, who valiantly sought change.

Expect more of this stuff as President Trump seeks to fulfill his campaign promises to veterans, especially if the new Secretary blunders with more rookie moves and gives the enemies of veterans a shot at him.
